



This project, which has been declared of general interest, is provided for in the Cantabrian Hydrographic Demarcation Hydrological Plan, as well as in the general protocol, signed in 2009, which established the general framework for collaboration in the field of sanitation and wastewater treatment, as part of the implementation of the National Water Quality Plan: Sanitation and Waste water Treatment 2007-2015.

This project is co-financed by the **European Regional Development Fund ERDF 2014-2020**, within the **Spanish Multi-regional Operational Programme (POPE)**, it contributes to the conservation of the environment and cultural heritage.

With these new facilities, wastewater treatment is guaranteed even during peak flows and high season. Thanks to the contribution of the ERDF fund, the treated water will comply with the specifications of the European regulations on wastewater treatment, reducing the generation of gases and odors and minimizing negative effects on the environment and the surrounding hydraulic public domain, as well as improving water quality.
